



Wildlife Conservation and Public Health: Unusual Partners in a Worldwide Dilemma



Rapid and dramatic environmental changes in our world – and how we deal with them – are bringing together two unusual partners: wildlife conservation and public health. Human-induced landscape and seascape changes, world population growth, world commerce and travel, urbanization, and global climate change are but some of the factors that are contributing to the emergence and spread of new disease problems throughout the world, both in human and animal populations.

Bird flu, West Nile virus, SARS, and Ebola are products of such changes. While we focus largely on the emerging human diseases, emerging diseases are also a worldwide problem in wildlife. And in fact, half of the 1,709 known human pathogens and three-fourths of the emerging diseases involve animals (are zoonotic). In his position as chief of wildlife disease research at the U.S. Dept. of Interior National Wildlife Health Center in Madison, Wisconsin, our speaker Christopher Brand will present some of our work in understanding, detecting, and controlling diseases in wildlife; how they affect wildlife; and their connection to human disease and public health.
