Kathleen West as accompanist.




Thanks in advance to Clarence Petersen as our torskemaster and deputy elf this month.

Anticipating Advent

I grew up anticipating Advent. It was a special time on the four Sundays before Christmas; lighting candles in the house. Our time involved a reading, and a kind of coming-of-age ceremony to find matches and get one to light without burning the tips of your fingers. The flame was mesmerizing and it burned for the duration of the Sunday meal thinking of the story and the Christmas to come.

Apparently that was the idea. The first mention of Advent occurred in the 300's A.D by a group of

church leaders that was called the Council of Sargossa. It gradually developed into a season that stretched across the month of December. "Advent" means "arrival" or "coming," derived from adventus in Latin. It gives us pause to think of the upcoming Christmas. It ends up that it does work.

The four weeks of Advent are broken down into the themes with a candle for each: First is Hope (or promise). The second week is Preparation; waiting or prophecy. The third is Joy or Peace. The last is Love and Adoration. A fifth candle is on some advent wreaths for the actual day of Christmas. This is the best of the readings: "For unto you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11).—Kayo L.
