The Status of Cod

Despite the gloomy reports of the demise of cod in the last decades, some good news was published by the publication Science last year. In an article by Erik Stokstad, despite overfishing, robust genetic diversity remains intact and that provides hope for recovery.

In short, they compared cod DNA from decades ago and found no sign of sweeping changes in the cod genomes, which could have limited the recovery. In addi-

tion, in the northeast Arctic, where fishing was curtailed and the size of the fleet reduced, cod are starting to thrive again. It is still limited though, and remains expensive.
